SURVEY METHODOLOGY

ANNENBERG SCIENCE KNOWLEDGE SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The Annenberg Science Knowledge (ASK) survey was conducted for the Annenberg Public Policy Center via telephone (CATI) by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from **August 11-August 15, 2016** among 1,475 U.S. adults, aged 18 and older, drawn from a national probability sample in all 50 states, and includes an oversample of 517 total Florida respondents. Total Non-Florida respondents numbered 958. The dual frame sample, included 337 Florida cell phone respondents, 576 Non-Florida Cell phone respondents, 26 Florida and 29 Non-Florida respondents who completed the survey in Spanish. Data were weighted to represent the target U.S. adult population and to represent the adult population of Florida. The adjusted margin of error for Florida respondents is +/- 5.39 % and +/-3.86% for Non-Florida respondents both at the 95% confidence level. The overall response rate was 9% (AAPOR RR 3).
